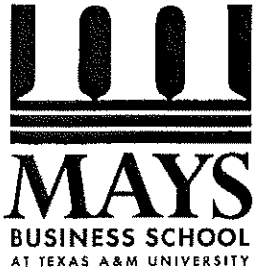

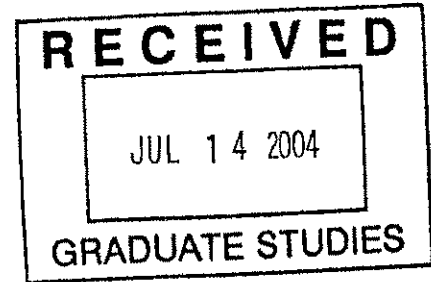

MAYS BUSINESS SCHOOL

CERTIFICATE IN BUSINESS MANAGEMENT

Prerequisites: Successful completion of Terms 1, 2, 3, and 4 of the Mays MBA Program

Requirements: Completion of at least 4 (12 credit hours) graduate level courses offered by the Mays Business School. These courses may not include ACCT 640, FINC 635, MKTG 621, and MGMT 655. All courses must be taken for grade. S/U grades do not count toward the certificate. The student must maintain at least a 3.0 GPR in the courses for the certificate.

Prior to registering for the certificate courses the MBA student must inform the Mays MBA Program office of their intention to take the certificate and present the proposed courses for approval by the office.

Courses for completing this certificate must be taken during the Spring Semester of Year 2 of the student's program.
